- 2028 – Existing councillors stand down and councils dissolved and new authorities take over.

Applications for Warm Home Grants Now Open

Mid Devon Council, in partnership with Devon County Council and other local authorities in Devon, is proud to deliver the Warm Homes Local Grant, a government-backed scheme designed to make homes across Devon warmer, greener, and more affordable to heat.

The scheme offers fully funded energy efficiency upgrades for eligible households, including measures such as cavity wall and loft insulation, double glazing, air source heat pumps, solar panels and insulated doors. These improvements not only reduce energy bills but also cut carbon emissions, supporting Devon's commitment to a sustainable future.

To qualify, homes must have an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating of D or below, and must either receive certain benefits or meet the specified low income criteria. Landlords can also apply, with one property fully funded and contributions required for additional homes.

Applications are opening in phases across Devon districts, and funding is limited, so early registration is encouraged. This initiative prioritises households most at risk of fuel poverty, ensuring that those who need help the most receive it. Link below.

Dear Members of the Parish Council,

We are writing to request financial support for the **Uffculme Community Pig Scheme (Clay Lane Pigs)**, a grassroots initiative that brings together members of our local community to engage in sustainable, hands-on pig rearing.

The scheme allows participants to purchase a whole or half pig and take part in all aspects of its care, from feeding and welfare to final processing. This immersive experience fosters a deeper understanding of ethical food production and strengthens community bonds. After a year's pause, the scheme successfully returned with **27 members** and the sale of **14 pigs**, demonstrating strong local interest and engagement.

Our members range from young families to older residents, including both experienced farmers and enthusiastic newcomers. The scheme has proven especially valuable in educating younger participants about the journey from farm to fork, promoting responsible food choices and agricultural awareness.

The cooperative is largely self-funding, and members cover all running costs arising. However, there are some capital items which are beyond the meagre reach of all members and UPC is requested to assist in this area.

To continue and improve the welfare of our animals, we are seeking a grant to fund:

- **A new pig ark and pig boards** (£1,188 incl. VAT) to provide shelter from the British weather [REDACTED]
- **Fence posts** (£178.08) to ensure secure and safe enclosures [REDACTED]
- **Total £1,366.08**

These improvements are essential to maintaining high welfare standards and ensuring the sustainability of the scheme for future seasons.

We appreciate your consideration and support in helping us continue this unique and educational community initiative.

Community Cafe at No11 The Square

We are writing on behalf of the newly-formed **No 11 Community Café Association** (No 11 CCA) to request a grant of up to **£500** from Uffculme Parish Council to support the initial establishment of a volunteer-run cafe at No 11 The Square.

The not-for-profit Association has been established to maintain and develop the café premises as a welcoming focal point for the community. Our aims include promoting wellbeing, social connection, recreational activity, and local economic resilience, supporting residents who may be experiencing social isolation, financial pressures, or challenges affecting mental health and wellbeing. Planned activities include a community cafe open to all on a Saturday morning, hosting the new Library of Things in partnership with the Green Team. Other cafe sessions will host existing activities such as a Co-Working group that supports people working from home, and a Bereavement cafe. We are in discussion with local people who would like to use the space, for example arts and crafts groups. Over time we hope to evolve with increased opening hours and retail opportunities for small local businesses such as bakery goods. We can offer hospitality training and experience to local people to help towards future employment, and there is potential for young people to use the space for indoor activities which they currently lack in the village.

The requested grant would be used for essential **initial fees and basic set-up costs**, including redecoration & signage, insurance, equipment servicing and utilities. This would allow us to prepare the premises for re-opening and ensure that the project has a stable footing in the early months while we establish a viable and sustainable business.

We are committed to operate transparently and in partnership with the owners of the premises, and to this end would like to invite a member of the parish council to take up a seat on the management committee of the Association.

We believe that the café has significant potential to bring long-term social value to the village, and we hope the Parish Council will feel able to support this early stage of development.

We will attend the Parish Council meeting on Monday 1st December in order to provide more information and answer any questions from councillors.

On behalf of the Uffculme Lights Committee, we would firstly like to give thanks for the very generous funding that was provided as part of the annual budget towards the cost of the lights. I hope you agree that they are looking fantastic, and create a positive environment for those both within the Parish and those who visit. This year however we have not been able to provide these lights within the initial set budget despite our efforts to fund raise throughout the year, and therefore would like to request an additional sum of £650.00 from the general community grant pot. towards the costs that do not currently have funding or grants allocated to them.

It is hoped that the Council can consider this further request for funding, and we would also respectfully request that a budget allocation amount of £1,500.00 plus £3,750.00 for the Council to pay the VAT as you have always done, is allowed for, as part of the the 2026 -2027 budget.

Traffic Working Group

Continued concerns raised regarding speeding on the B3440/Uffculme Rd (vehicles exceeding 30 mph near Lucombe Park), and Commercial Rd (vehicles exceeding the 20 mph limit).

Over the last two months, we received enquiries from more individuals, groups, and a local organisation concerned about ongoing speeding and asking about the CSW initiative. They received a detailed overview of how it works and a step-by-step guide on how to sign up.

Currently waiting on feedback from the local CSW coordinator to see if there have been any new volunteers that could allow them to field a full team.

Youth Working Group

I am converting the youth survey template I sent to Uffculme primary and secondary schools into a Google Forms link to distribute.

I will request a review of the form (which will be free of identifiers outside of Key Stage group) and suggest the schools send it to Primary School parents and either do the same for Secondary School pupils, or have them complete it in an ICT/PSHE lesson. Hopefully, this will lead to direct and quantifiable feedback sooner.



Considering the data we have (starting May 2005), there appears to be a slight increase over time for priority crimes like Violence and Sexual Offences, Criminal Damage and Arson, and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB). Compared against the Mid Devon totals, Uffculme accounts for 1.5-2.7% of reported crime totals, which is in line with our total population being 3% of the Mid Devon population.



ASB remains one of the most visible crimes, with limited feedback and outcomes data due to how it is handled, but tends to occur as a spike of activity and then periods of calm.
